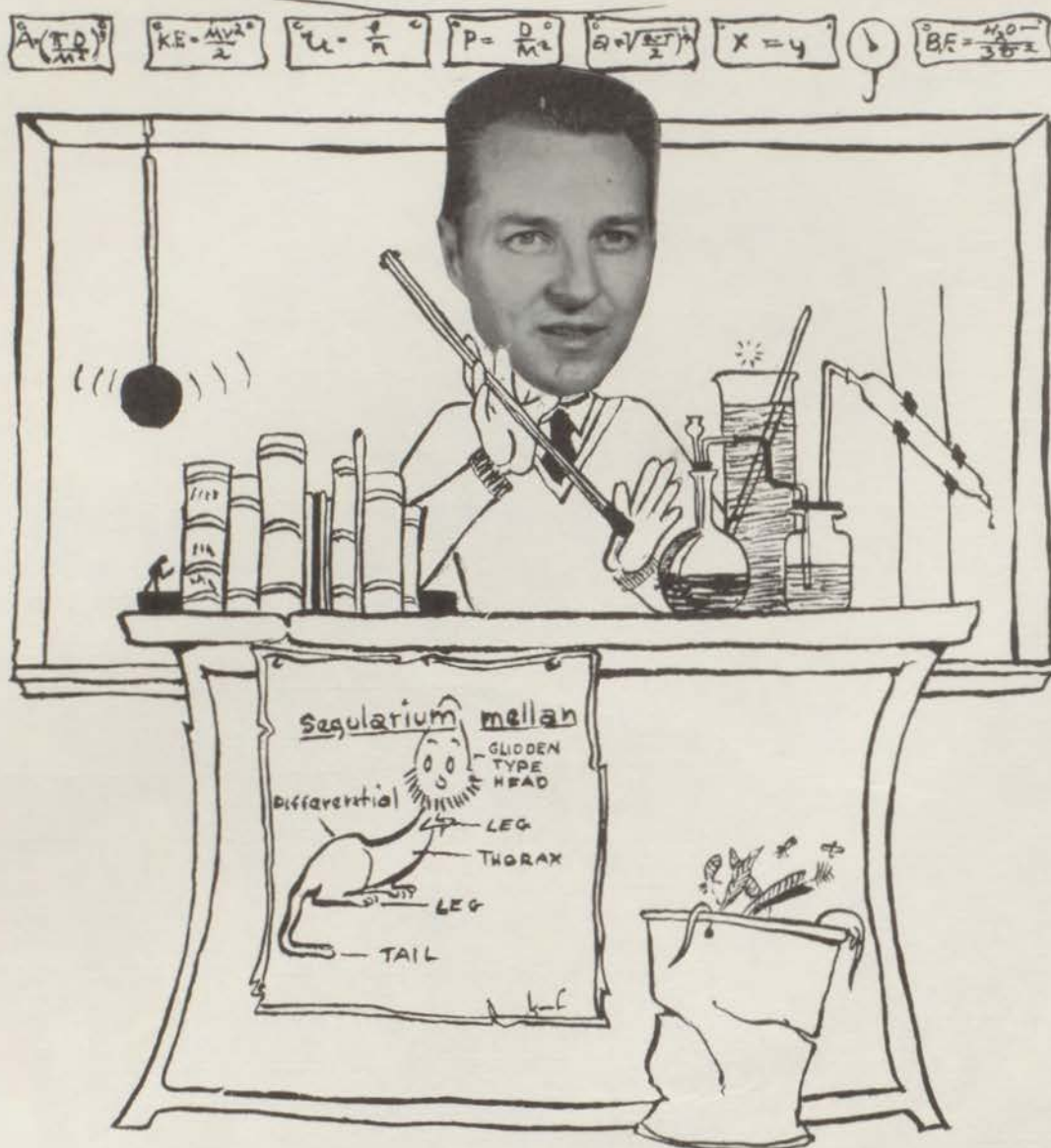

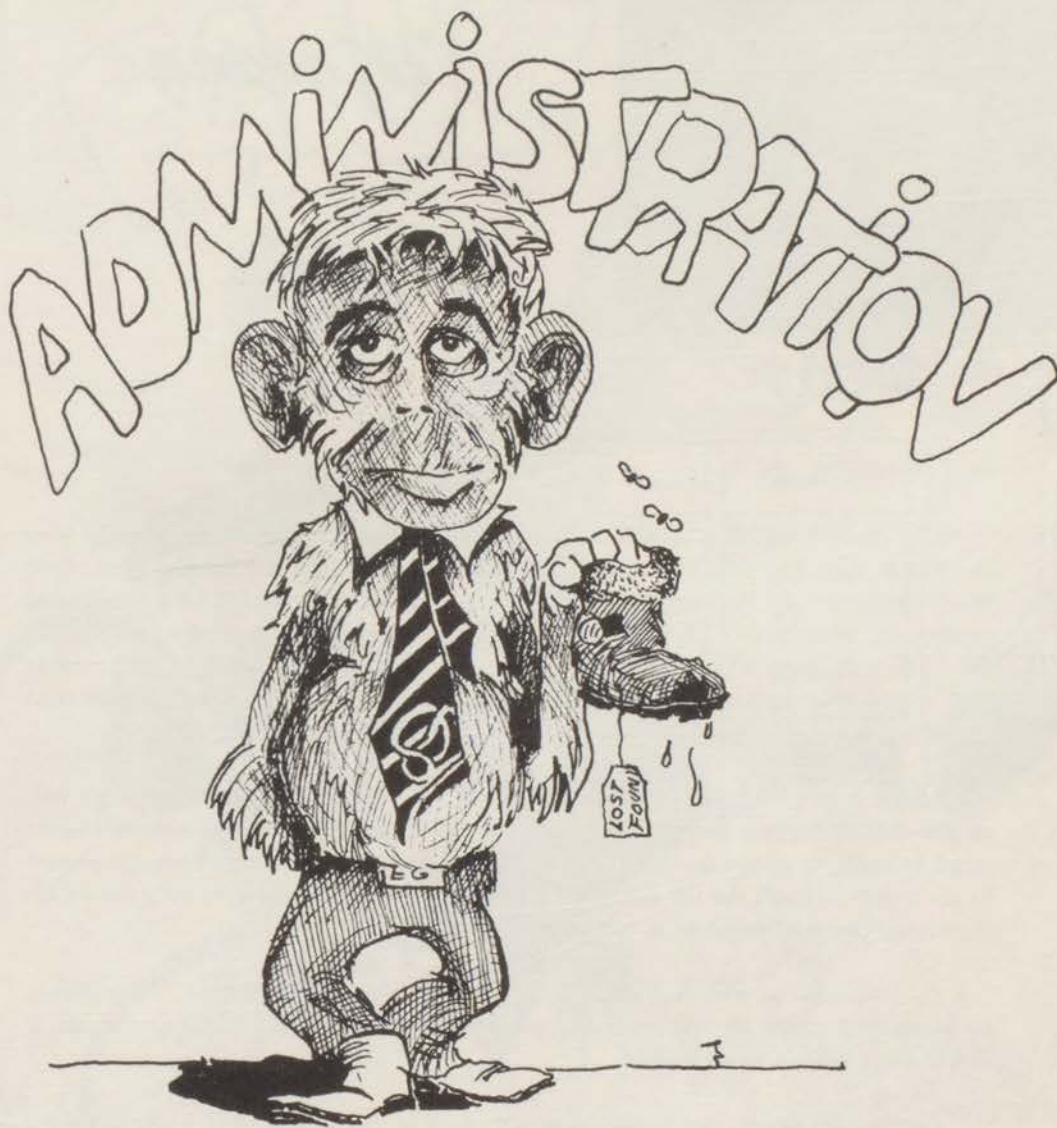
Dedication

Our wish for success and happiness goes to each of you seniors--and our hope for the undergraduates is that their coming years in high school will be fruitful and well lived.

Good luck to the team of '56-'57.



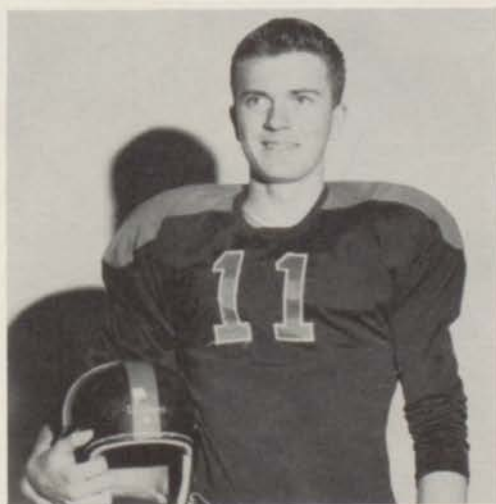

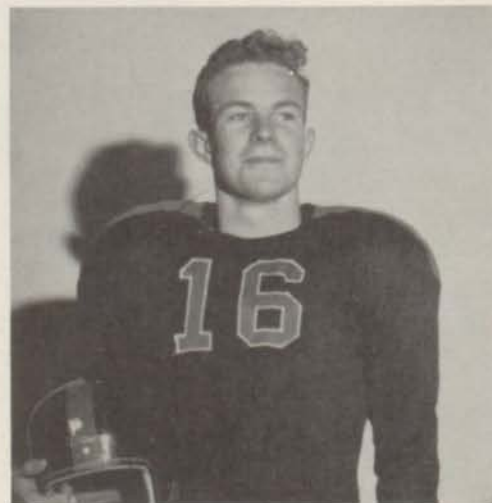

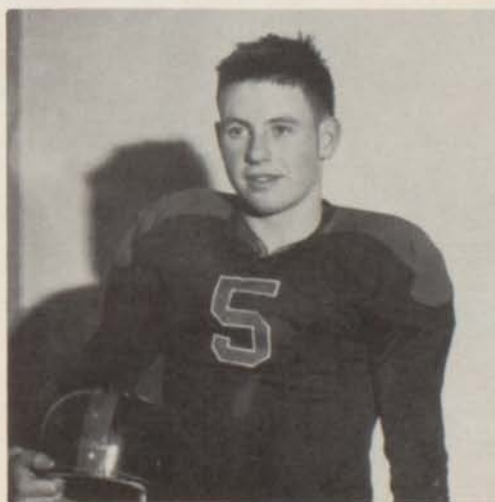

Being able to conduct themselves in the right manner on the floor and off is as important a trait as winning.

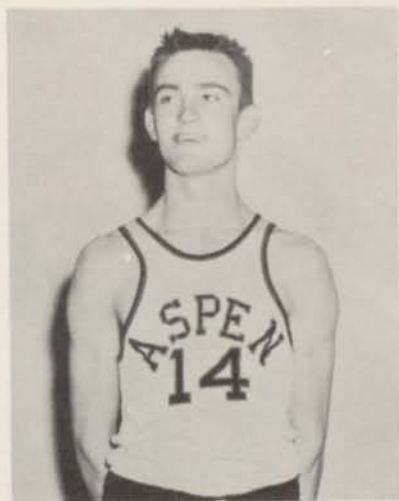
More and more boys are going out for this sport, showing that Coach Earl Burrows is doing a good job. He is to be commended for his patient and capable instruction.
